What your child will be learning this month

Language Arts:

- Continued/starting work with elements of prose, drama and poetry
- We will start another novel after our winter break. Each class may do different 4th grade level novels this time after reading <u>Esperanza Rising</u> together. It was a great story set in the 1930's but still rings true today.

Writing:

We will or have started work with opinion writing. Students need to back up their
opinions with facts, evidence, examples and details. It is a lot but the most powerful
writing that we teach.

Math:

- Module 7 started with halving to divide by 2, 4, 8 and also covers fractions, including studies of equivalent fractions and adding/subtracting fractions.
- Next, Module 8 will be on division with partial quotients (simular to partial products taught in multiplication) and a little of multiplying fractions.

Science:

- Begin new unit in Earth Science about minerals, rocks and the rock cycle and how weathering and erosion play a huge role in the cycle
- Informational text studies- incorporating information on a topic from two or more text sources

Social Studies:

- Finishing unit on California Missions
- Beginning the end of Mission Life and the start of the revolt that led to Mexico's take-over of California
